STUDENT MOBILITY AGRIBUSINESS STUDENTS

1. INTERNSHIP IN JAPAN

Punctuality with a GPA above 3.25 plus internship experience abroad is of course the target of the Agribusiness Study Program. One way to increase the number of graduates on time is that the Agribusiness Study Program has prepared a distribution of courses that students must complete in class in 6 semesters or 3 years, then students are asked to complete a series of final assignments, starting from KKN, PKL and Thesis. To speed things up, the Agribusiness Study Program then provides students with the opportunity to take part in an Internship Program abroad ranging from 3 to 8 months. This program, in line with the MBKM Program, will provide students with the opportunity to convert their final assignment series to a total of 15 credits. Therefore, this program is specifically for the classes of 2019 and 2020. The Agribusiness Study Program provides assistance

Temporary work experience (internship/internship/field work practice) given to students by companies or organizations is part of the Agribusiness Study Program curriculum which students must follow. Apart from government agencies, students can also do internships in companies operating in the agricultural sector from upstream to downstream. The selection of companies is carried out by students with the approval of their supervisor. Since 2017, the Agribusiness Study Program, Faculty of Science and Technology, UIN Syarif HIdayatullah Jakarta has provided students with the opportunity to do internships abroad, namely Japan. This program is running well and has sent until 2022 at least 15 students.

In 2023, 21 students have been selected who will intern in Japan and will be placed in agricultural companies in the Hokaido and Nagasaki regions. Students will depart in several groups, the closest one will depart in early August 2023. Students who take part in this program must take part in a selection first, namely an academic selection and an interview regarding motivation for joining the program. Selected students will be included in language and language training programs. Japanese culture within 3 months. Students are expected to gain basic knowledge about culture and be able to carry out basic communication which will help them while in Japan. Next, students will go to Japan according to the placement they received and carry out an internship for 6 - 8 months.

Apart from Japan, the Agribusiness Study Program collaborates with Univ. Binawan in the Working Holiday in Germany (WHG) program. This program is also an internship program, where selected students will be placed in several companies or industries operating in the agribusiness sector. This program, which will only be implemented in 2023, will send 10 selected students this October. The internship program in Germany will be held for 3 months (October – December 2023). Before departure, students are also asked to prepare administrative requirements and basic language training.




Figure 3. Documentation of PKS Signing between FST and Univ. Binawan

The placement of students in the WHG Program will be in accordance with their scientific background in industry in Germany. Students of the Agribusiness study program themselves will be directed to Chocolate Manufacturing or the Hospitality industry, especially in the raw material supply and food and beverage management. Until this article was released, the process being carried out by students was language and work culture training through zoom meetings and visa processing.



The release activity was carried out using online media, Zoom

Meeting.

This release activity is a sign that the Internship Program to Japan for Agribusiness Study Program Students has started again. The Head of the Agribusiness Study Program in his report stated that 3 students would be leaving for Japan on Friday, March 18 2022 and 5 students on Wednesday, March 23 2022. The students who were leaving were students who had registered for the batch 1 internship program in 2020 and were unable to leave due to the pandemic . In 2020, there will be more students leaving, but because some have already graduated, currently there are only 8 people left. There are 14 students registered for the batch 2 internship program.

Mrs. Evy as Director of PT KIBO gave an overview of the implementation of internships in Japan, starting from the students' departure on Friday, March 18 2022, gathering at Soekarno Hatta airport to Haneda airport, Japan. Students will carry out independent isolation first and after that they will be picked up by company representatives in Japan to be taken to their internship location, an Agribusiness company. This first appointment was not only from UIN Jakarta but there were 2 other institutions.



Welcome remarks at the release were delivered by the Dean of FST, Deputy Chancellor for Cooperation and Deputy Chancellor for Student Affairs. In general, the remarks reminded students to always do their best and look after each other. According to Prof. this collaboration for internship activities in Japan. Dr. Lily Surraya Eka Putri, M.Env.Stud (Deputy Chancellor for Cooperation) should have their level increased, not only with the Agribusiness study program but also up to universities so that other study programs can follow suit. Dr. Arief Subhan, M.Ag. (Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs) apart from giving a speech, he also led a prayer so that this program could run smoothly from implementation until the students returned to Indonesia.



Before the activity closed, there was a delivery of hopes. Head of Puskarir UIN Jakarta, Salamah Agung, M.A., Ph.D stated that this internship program was very good and asked students to share their experiences with all UIN Jakarta students later. Representatives of student parents also expressed their hopes and feelings of happiness because their children could finally go to Japan for internships. As the final series of events, 3 students introduced themselves in Japanese. The activity ended at 17.10 WIB. (RAPS)
